In-Person Format

Activity: Trivia

Activity Description: Easy to implement and highly interactive, this event works in the classroom. EVERFI has created a financial trivia game. All you need is a laptop and projector.

Volunteer Arrival: <ul style="list-style-type: none">In-person events – Volunteers are encouraged to arrive at the school at least 15 minutes prior to the event start time to allow time for visitor check-in with the main office. Student Arrival <ul style="list-style-type: none">Students begin to arrive to their classroom	5-15 minutes
Opening Remarks <p>The teacher will introduce and welcome guests.</p> <p>Introduction Suggestions: <i>Below are some things you can share during your introduction:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">General background informationHow did you get started in banking?Why do you think this course is important?What do you do in your day-to-day role?Show of hands, how many of you know what career you want to pursue?Raise your hand if you know of someone who works in a bank	5 minutes
Student Activity <p>Trivia (In-Person)</p> <p>Challenge students by scenario-based questions that reinforce learnings from the course. This activity will allow volunteers to engage with students and shed expertise into the subject matter.</p>	20-30 minutes

<p>Directions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Split up the class into 2+ different teams, have them agree on a team name. • Decide who will keep score on each team. • Write “A”, “B”, and “C” on separate notecards. • Assign a score keeper to keep track of points earned and which questions on the board have already been answered. • Each group will take turns selecting a category and amount. • Each group will have 20 seconds to give an answer. • Each group will hold their answers up at the same time. • For each correct answer, your group will earn the amount of points for that question. • We encourage you to shed insight on why the answer is what it is and ask students their opinions too! 	
<p>Student Q&A</p> <p>Leave time for students to ask questions! Students can either submit questions ahead of time or we can open the floor to students to ask questions in real time. Below are a few questions you may ask the students if you have extra time:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have you talked about this course with friends or family? What lessons did you share? • What were you surprised to learn that might be opposite what you thought previously? • When it comes to your future, what excites you and most worries you? • What types of jobs are you considering in your future? 	10 minutes
<p>Concluding Remarks/Farewell</p> <p>Be sure to thank the students and teachers for participating in the event.</p>	2 minutes
<p>Follow Up/ Feedback</p> <p>Please consider sending the teacher a thank you email to the teacher and invite his/her feedback by completing a quick post-event survey.</p>	

Helpful Tips:

- To start: divide the class up into teams, have them give themselves a team name, and begin!
- We recommend sending the link to the game to the teacher ahead of the event so that they can get everything set up.
- Make sure you leave time at the end of your visit for students to ask you questions about your job and personal finance – students love hearing from local experts.
- You can also bring a prize for the winning team. This is completely at your discretion and can be anything from branded swag to school supplies to a choice

of snacks or food. If you plan on bringing snacks or food, be sure to check with the teacher to adhere to the school's policy and be mindful of student allergies.
