

Game A: Truist Financial Foundations Trivia

Recommended Number of Volunteers: 1-2

Activity Overview

Easy to implement and highly interactive, this trivia activity works in classrooms of all sizes. All you need is a laptop and the school's projector to test students' personal finance knowledge.

Logistics:

- **In-Person:** Share the PowerPoint game with the teacher ahead of time and ask them to use a projector to broadcast the game
- **Virtual:** Confirm that you have screen-sharing abilities in the meeting platform

Sample Run of Show:

3 minutes	Welcome/Kick-Off Students are settling into their seats
10 minutes	Truist Volunteer Introductions + About Truist Volunteers will share their name, role at Truist, role responsibilities, and what their first job was
20 minutes	Trivia Game
10 minutes	Question and Answer Allow students to ask about your role, game questions, careers at Truist, etc.
2 minutes	Farewell & Thank You Remarks

Run of Show

Welcome & Teammate Introductions (5 Minutes)

Run of Show

Trivia Game (20 Min)

- Today, we will be playing a trivia style game where you will be working in groups to acquire the most points possible while testing your knowledge of the Truist Financial Foundations Course.

Here's how it will work:

- *Break into equal groups with approximately 4-6 team members on each team. Pick team names.*
- *Decide who in your group will keep your team's score or the teacher can keep track on their whiteboard.*
- *Write "A", "B", "C" on separate notecards.*
- *Each group will take turns selecting a category and amount.*
- *Each group will have 20 seconds to decide on an answer.*
- *All groups will hold their answers at the same time.*
- *For every correct answer, your group will earn the number of points for that question.*
- *The team at the end of the game with the most points is the winner*

Open Student Q&A (10 minutes)

Thank you everyone for your engagement during the game. We would now like to open the floor up to any questions you may have. These can be questions about future careers, our jobs at Truist, or follow-up questions you have about the Truist Financial Foundation course.

Students may be shy at first, but remind them that you are there to help them. If they don't have any questions, feel free to talk a little bit more about your career and share advice.

Optional topics/talking points:

- *What's one habit that you think has been helpful in growing as a professional?*
- *What are some roles within a financial institution that do not require a finance/business/math background but perhaps more of a creative background.*
- *What is one thing you wish you knew when you started your career?*
- *Do you have advice on how to find great jobs? (networking, LinkedIn, jobsites, Etc.)*
- *It can be intimidating to start building work experience and carving your professional path. What advice do you have for students who are just getting started with their careers?*
